Global Money Week (GMW) FAQs

1 What is Global Money Week (GMW)?

Global Money Week (GMW) is a money awareness celebration. The goal is to teach children and youth about money, saving, creating livelihoods, gaining employment and becoming an entrepreneur through interactive and fun activities. Every year, entire communities take action to create awareness, challenge out of date financial policies and give young people the tools and inspiration they need to shape their own future. GMW takes place annually, during the second week of March. The events are organized by schools, universities, government ministries, central banks, financial institutions, companies, members of the civil society and youth worldwide. GMW is initiated and coordinated by Child and Youth Finance International (CYFI).

2 What is the theme of Global Money Week 2015?

GMW 2015's theme is 'Save today. Safe tomorrow.' Why? Because: social and financial exclusion lead to an unsafe tomorrow where there is excessive spending and no saving. If we want a safer tomorrow we need to do something today. How? Join Global Money Week. Because, to have a safe tomorrow we should begin to save today.

3 When is Global Money Week?

Global Money Week (GMW) is taking place in the second week of March each year. The exact dates for the GMW 2015 are: **2015 – March 9-17**

4 What has been Global Money Week outreach?

We are expecting around 3 million children and youth participants in over 100 countries during GMW 2015.

- 3 million children and youth
- 118 countries
- 490 organizations
- Over 2000 activities

GMW outreach in 2013

- 1 million children and youth
- 80 countries
- 400 organizations

GMW outreach in 2012

- 21 countries (Child Finance Day/Week)

- The Second Annual Regional Meeting for Europe and Central Asia, hosted and organized in collaboration with the European Central Bank, was held on November 4-5, 2013.
- In 2012, CYFI's Managing Director Jeroo Billimoria was awarded by the Union of Arab Banks for the achievements of the CYF Movement. Among the other awardees was Managing Director of the IMF Christine Lagarde.
- In 2013, CYFI was listed in the Top 100 NGO list published by the Global Journal. It was also given the honor of "most promising NGO."
