The African Artists Peace Initiative (AAPI) was founded in May 2014, as a Pan-African movement of artists and peace-makers, championing a culture of peace and non-violence in Africa. The overarching objective is to use "ARTS" as a weapon and tool for nurturing a culture of peace based on values, attitude, and ways of life conducive to the promotion of peace among individuals, groups and society.

AAPI, shall be launching its first international activities on the 21st of September, 2015. As stated by the United Nations, "Each year the International Day of Peace is observed around the world on 21 September. The General Assembly has declared this as a day devoted to strengthening the ideals of peace, both within and among all nations and peoples." As AAPI, we shall be joining the world as "Artists" and "Peacemakers" using different creative mediums in expressing the need to maintain and propagate the culture of peace, justice and security for all.

The campaign #Action9/21 takes place on the 21st of September, 2015 under the theme '#InspireACultureOfPeace'. This is an opportunity to Show, Share, and Spread across Africa and the world - What Peace Means To Us! The African Artists Peace Initiative (AAPI) intends to make a unique contribution to peace advocacy and education through the creative arts. More importantly, AAPI will demonstrate how the arts can be applied to achieve important social objectives in the African society.
