# EEASA 2015 Background

EEASA is an organisation for environmental educators in the SADC region. Its membership is comprised of educators in all levels, researchers, environmentalists, NGO's, learners and professional environmental organisations. EEASA is governed by an elected council which coordinates and implements the decisions taken in conferences. The organization provides a forum for EE practitioners and learners to share their experiences and ideas necessary for developing EE practises and related fields in the region. Swaziland has been a partner in the development of EEASA and was instrumental in ensuring that the organization develops into an efficient regional forum.

The 33<sup>rd</sup> annual EEASA Conference will be held at Esibayeni Lodge, Matsapha, Swaziland from the 21<sup>st</sup> -24<sup>th</sup> of September 2015. The conference is being hosted by the Swaziland Environment Authority (SEA) in collaboration with the University of Swaziland, Swaziland National Trust Commission, Ministry of Education and Lower Usuthu Sustainable Land Management. There is a limit of 600 delegates at the conference; hence an early registration of an interest to attend the conference is essential.

# **Conference Theme**

The theme of the Conference is "*Creating sustainable societies: Scaling up ESD through Global Action Programme*". The theme responds to the post UN decade of Education for Sustainable Development as well as the coming to an end of the Millennium Development Goals (MDGs) whilst at the same time acknowledging the imminent launch of the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

The Conference will focus on critical environment and sustainable development issues with particular attention paid to how different stakeholders and entities, both public and private, participate in the undertaking of activities aimed at the realization of the *future we want*. The main rationale for hosting the EEASA conference is to raise awareness and motivate local and regional stakeholders and entities to commit to the implementation of the Rio+20 outcomes as well as the post UNDESD Global Action Programme (GAP) enshrined in the Nagoya Declaration recently adopted in Japan.

Papers for the conference will be grouped under the following sub-themes or working groups:

- 1. Governance and social stability in attaining sustainable development
- 2. Actions and opportunities for ESD within the GAP framework
- 3. Mainstreaming ESD and Climate Change Education in the formal and nonformal education curriculum
- 4. Mobilizing Children and Youth for ESD
- 5. The media and social media as tools for ESD
- 6. Indigenous knowledge, culture and community involved in ESD
- 7. Policy innovation, support and implementation in ESD
- 8. Strengthening ESD and SDG's in the post 2015 era
- 9. Green economy, sustainable production and consumption in the 21<sup>st</sup> century
- 10. Sustainable towns and cities in Southern Africa
