A Call for Participation

Sharing the Results

Beyond 2015 has facilitated a platform and was joined by organizations, networks, coalitions, campaigns communities and groups calling for a stronger civil society participation in the post-2015 negotiations. The "<u>Call for Participation</u>" was distributed in <u>English</u>, <u>Spanish</u>, <u>French</u> and <u>Portuguese</u> and was open for **five days** (December 10-15 2015) via a Google Form.

The "Call for Participation" counted on the support of organizations from all over the world – big and small, global and local, from the South and from the North. Some represents large constituencies; others are strongly connected with small communities and groups, and all are calling for CSOs and citizen participation to be a part of the formal and official post-2015 process.

By December 16, 826 organizations from 110 countries have joined the Call.

From the total list, Africa was the most represented, with signatories from 36 countries, followed by Europe (28), Asia (18), Latin America (14), Caribbean (6), Pacific (5) and North America (3).

Africa was the region with more organizations (257, 31% of signatories); followed by Europe (181, 22%); Asia (153, 18.5%), Latin America (115, 14%), North America (65, 8%); Pacific (23, 2.8%); Caribbean (20, 2.4%) and Global (11, 1.3%).

We are thankful to all partners that joined this call and hope that this Call will be considered by UN Member States as this represents a good level of interest and commitment from citizen organizations from all over the world.
